

Commitment to the Environment




Cameron LNG meets all the conditions of its environmental permits, and is in full compliance with all environmental laws and regulations.

Cameron LNG works in partnership with local groups to fund programs that help wetlands thrive, create more habitats, improve fisheries and provide better birding – all of which contribute to a healthier ecosystem overall.

The company also supports local school and community groups in clean-up events and efforts to promote environmental stewardship.

Protecting Southwest Louisiana's Ecosystems

Forty-three percent of the nation's threatened and endangered species depend on wetlands for some stage of their life cycle. Wetlands provide nesting sites for egrets, herons, cormorants, ibis, alligators, mottled ducks and other wildlife like nutria, muskrat, rails, raccoon, mink, otter, opossum and white-tailed deer.

Wetland Creation: During construction of the regasification facilities, Cameron LNG worked with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, state and federal agencies and local landowners to identify areas best suited to create new wetlands to offset the LNG facility's impact on nearby wetlands. To date, we've created more than 500 acres of new wetlands with a goal of creating additional acres of marsh wetlands.

Natural gas is the cleanest burning of all fossil fuels, generating 20 percent less carbon dioxide (CO₂) than conventional fuels.

Additionally, Cameron LNG has donated more than \$100,000 to local non-profit organizations to help restore wetlands.

Black Lake Terracing Project:

By partnering with Ducks Unlimited, Cameron LNG restored over 900 acres of eroded marshlands in Cameron Parish. By adding terraces and vegetation to Black Lake, wave energy was reduced and water clarity improved, creating additional waterfowl habitats that contribute to a healthier ecosystem.

Engaging the Community Energized by the Environment:

To promote environmental stewardship, Cameron LNG partners with the Hackberry Duck-off organization to hold an annual photo and drawing contest with school-age children to showcase the beauty of the environment of Southwest Louisiana. The program creates a lot of excitement in the region and winning entries are featured in the Cameron LNG calendar that is distributed to the community.

Each year the contest incorporates environmental themes. Over 100 school children usually participate and the winners are showcased in a local exhibit.



Community Beautification:

Cameron LNG sponsors community clean-up and beautification events, including hurricane clean-up, building a new community garden and promoting environmental programs that help students learn about local ecosystems.
