Our Commitment

Cameron LNG has been a community partner in Southwest Louisiana for more than 17 years. Starting with the development of our natural gas regasification terminal in 2004 through its conversion to a liquefaction facility beginning in 2014, we have been dedicated to being a responsible corporate citizen and a good neighbor. We are committed to investing in the communities where we work and live to support their growth, resiliency, and safety.

We are also proud of the efforts and dedication of our employees who work diligently to realize our vision of providing safe, efficient, and cost-effective natural gas liquefaction services to our partners, their customers, and the global communities that depend on energy reliability and security.

Our Giving Priority Areas

Cameron LNG contributed \$300,000 in community partnership funds in Cameron and Calcasieu parishes in 2021, bringing our total contributions to \$3.3 million since 2004. At Cameron LNG, we encourage and applaud employee involvement in our communities. Through the Cameron LNG Employee Giving Fund (EGF), employees voluntarily participate in a payroll deduction program supporting nonprofit charitable organizations. In 2021, there was a 30 percent increase in employee participation, with over one-third of existing contributors increasing their donation to the fund. In partnership with the Community Foundation of Southwest Louisiana to administer the fund, the EGF Employee Board approved the distribution of \$34,000 to 11 nonprofits in 2021.



SOWELA CORPORATE PHILANTHROPY AWARD

In November, SOWELA Technical Community College presented the Outstanding Leadership in Corporate Philanthropy award to Cameron LNG. This award recognizes a business for its culture of philanthropy,

as well as its outstanding commitment to SOWELA. This commitment includes financial support, leadership involvement, volunteer participation and dedication of its workforce, and enables the college to provide leading educational programs and services to help students achieve success.



2021 COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

Cameron LNG is committed to environmental stewardship and provides funding to partners that promote and advance the preservation and restoration of the coastal zone's marsh, wetland areas, and wildlife.

Restoration and Preservation

With a \$15,000 grant to the Moore-Odom Wildlife Foundation, we supported efforts to build terraces to protect against coastal erosion in marshes near Hackberry. The marsh area is home to several livestock and wildlife species, including cattle,



waterfowl, trans-gulf migrant land birds, alligators, white-tailed deer, and the rare Crested Caracara.

ECONOMIC PROSPERITY AND LEADERSHIP

As a company dedicated to enhancing the economic prosperity and resilience of the region where we operate, Cameron LNG works alongside community and business leaders to invest time and resources to support local economies and communities.

Building Resiliency in the Region

Cameron LNG has been a Visionary Society member of the Community Foundation of Southwest Louisiana for more than six years. In 2021, we provided funds for the Foundation's Just Imagine SWLA project to create a 50-year resilience plan for



Calcasieu and Cameron Parishes. In addition, our Foundation contribution helped develop a partnership with the National Parks Service to enhance eco-tourism opportunities in the region.

EDUCATION | STEM

Today's students are tomorrow's workforce and leaders who will shape our future. We partner annually with local schools, technical colleges, and universities to promote learning and development. Our outreach initiatives help prepare future generations and grow a vibrant workforce. Since 2012, we have given \$189,500 to Cameron Parish School graduates pursuing higher education through our competitive scholarship program.

Scholarships for STEM Careers

Each year, Cameron LNG provides \$20,000 in scholarship funds to the foundations at McNeese State **University and SOWELA Technical** Community College. Students pursuing careers in engineering, process technology, industrial instrumentation technology, and



industrial electrical technology will be awarded scholarships.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS & SAFETY

The health, safety, and security of our workforce and the community are at the center of everything we do. Our relationships with law enforcement agencies and emergency responders in Cameron and Calcasieu parishes support our commitment to emergency preparedness and safety. We are also proud of our Safe Communities initiative, which funds programs to eradicate hunger, provide healthcare screenings and other critical services to improve the quality of life for those in need.

Eradicating Food Insecurity

Care Help of Sulphur's Backpack Blessing Program distributes more than 550 bags a week to our local Sulphur, Carlyss, and Hackberry schools to provide school-age children in need with nutritious food each weekend. In 2021, Cameron LNG's support of this program included



funding for food, as well as more than 10,000 bags.
